## Improving Oklahoma's Oral Health through NIDCR Funding:

- The Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation is conducting research on Primary Sjögren's syndrome. Sjögren's syndrome is a chronic autoimmune disorder that affects salivary and lacrimal glands causing severe dry eye and mouth. This study seeks to elucidate the mechanism by which auto-reactive antibodies cause disease symptoms to arise. Results from this study could contribute to the development of new diagnostic tests and treatments for Sjögren's syndrome.
- Researchers at the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center have complementary research on Sjögren's syndrome currently underway. Using a large cohort of Sjögren's patients, this study aims to investigate how abnormal mitochondrial function, oxidative stress and metabolic syndrome are interconnected and contribute to disease progression. A better understanding of the underlying mechanisms in Sjögren's syndrome will provide insight into the most effective ways to treat the disease.
